8. **Summary of new results of the thesis:**

8.1. *New academic and theoretical contributions*

First, the thesis advances a conceptualization of grassroots Party organizations and their quality in state-owned commercial banks in Vietnam at present. It also synthesizes emerging practical issues in building grassroots Party organizations within state-owned commercial banks in Vietnam today.

Second, the thesis proposes a comprehensive system of solutions, including two distinctive and breakthrough measures: strengthening training and capacity-building for full-time Party affairs officials and Party committees at all levels; and promoting digital transformation and administrative reform within the Party.

8.2. *New practical contributions*

The thesis analyzes the current situation and forecasts favorable and adverse factors affecting the quality of grassroots Party organizations in state-owned commercial banks in Vietnam, and proposes eight groups of solutions, including: (1) raising awareness among Party committees at all levels of the importance of improving the quality of grassroots Party organizations to fulfill the political tasks of the banking sector; (2) strengthening training and capacity-building for full-time Party affairs officials and Party committees; (3) renewing the promulgation and implementation of resolutions, programs, and action plans on building and consolidating grassroots Party organizations within the system of the State Bank of Vietnam; (4) strictly enforcing the Party's organizational and operational principles, particularly democratic centralism and self-criticism and criticism; (5) enhancing Party membership development and promoting the role of socio-political organizations in state-owned commercial banks; (6) perfecting and effectively implementing working regulations of grassroots Party organizations; (7) promoting digital transformation and administrative reform within the Party; and (8) strengthening review, inspection, supervision, commendation, and discipline. These solutions not only reinforce internal Party building but also improve governance transparency, risk control, and financial system stability.
